The Jordan Smelski Foundation for Amoeba Awareness was established in loving memory of Jordan Cole Smelski, who passed away from Primary Amoebic Meningoencephalitis on July 2, 2014. The ameba *Naegleria fowleri* is found world-wide, usually in warm, or hot fresh water. *Naegleria fowleri* has been found in lakes, rivers, streams, hot springs, under chlorinated swimming pools, private wells and under chlorinated public water systems. This free-living ameba can be deadly if contracted up through the nose. The Jordan Smelski Foundation is committed to funding research, training videos for healthcare professionals and creating awareness of this deadly organism. Currently this disease is 98% fatal, yet 100% preventable.
